

FY2026 Allocations Preparation Checklist

This checklist is designed to help you prepare for the [Philadelphia EMA's Regional Allocation Process](#). If you follow all of these steps you will be prepared to participate in your region's allocations meeting. You can adapt this checklist to your needs. Not everyone will need to follow every step. People who have little or no experience with the Allocations process are encouraged to go through all the steps for the most meaningful participation.

Step 1. Register for your region's allocations meetings:

You need to register for both mandatory (Parts 1 & 2) meetings for your region to attend.
